

Dear Friends,

As a partner in Westchester's future economic growth, we are writing to ensure you are aware of clean energy programs and funding opportunities available within the region's gas constrained areas.

Recently, New York State announced its \$250 million Clean Energy Action Plan (Action Plan) for Westchester to provide local investment in clean energy alternatives. This funding enables the New York State Energy Research and Development Authority (NYSERDA) to enhance incentives for developers who want to include alternative heating and cooling systems and enhance energy efficiency measures in new construction, multi-family buildings and commercial projects. NYSERDA is also launching a community awareness program in the upcoming months to help businesses and homeowners understand new energy solutions and access available programs and incentives for heating their homes and buildings with clean resources and increasing energy efficiency.

In addition to funding from NYSERDA, the Action Plan includes funds Con Edison committed to deploying heat pumps and increasing gas efficiency for residential, multifamily and commercial and industrial customers, as well as support from the New York Power Authority to provide additional low-cost financing services to its Westchester customers. <https://www.nypa.gov/>
